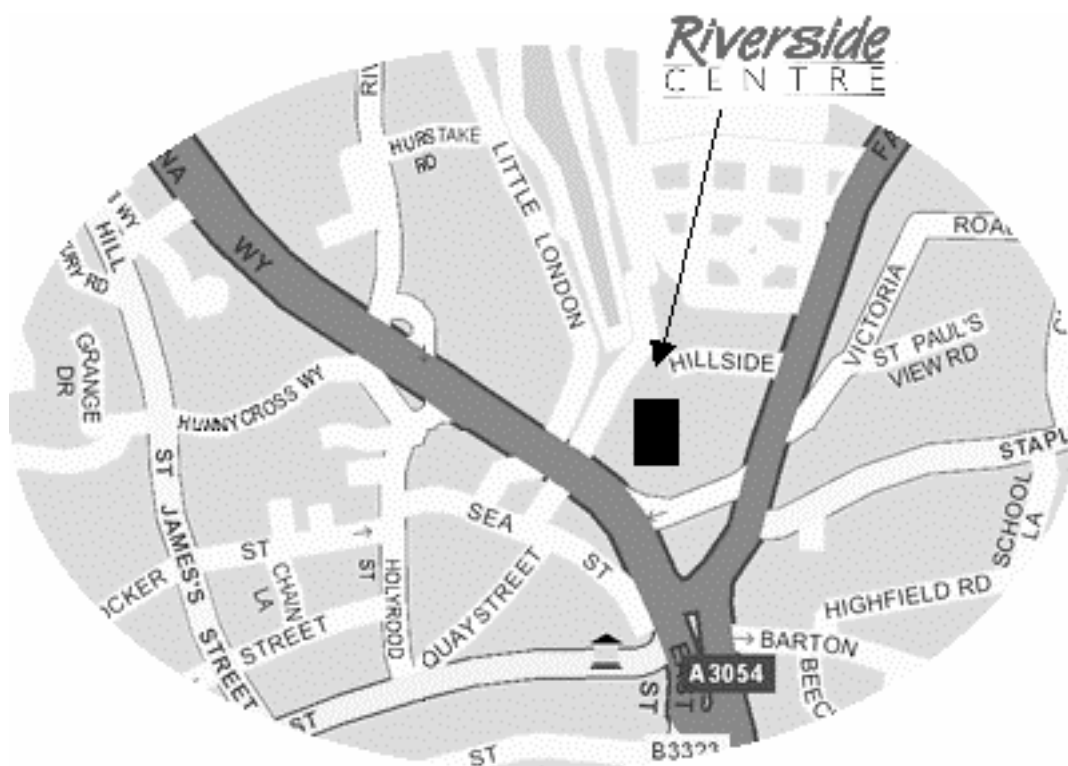

For many partially sighted people, well-designed print information using a minimum of 12-point text is enough, although the RNIB recommend 14 point, to reach more people with sight problems. Large print documents are produced in a larger type size, ranging from 16 to 22 point.

Others will need this information in a different format to standard print. This could be larger print, spoken word audio on cassette tape, Braille, CD Rom, electronic documents on floppy disk or over the Internet.

Spoken word audio on tape has the benefit that everyone is able to use it except those with very poor hearing. It is also ideal for people with learning difficulties, low literacy levels, or those who may have problems with their hands.
